Annual Lions Clubs International Convention

The 94th Annual Lions Clubs International Convention is being held in Seattle, WA on July 4 – 8, 2011. The deadline for advance registration and hotel reservations is May 1, 2011. Registrations after this date will be processed in Seattle. Registration forms can be found in the monthly Lion Magazine. There have been 50 Lions from Multi-district 5 registered to date for the international convention. Visit <http://www.lionsclubs.org> for more information on the convention and city of Seattle.

The convention has musical, laser and dance performances, awards ceremonies and speakers that include Condoleezza Rice, former Secretary of State, as Keynote

speaker. Music is woven throughout the convention week. Many educational workshops will be available to include training for the different leadership roles in a club and district.

The parade step-off is on Tuesday, July 5 at 11:00am. Multi-district 5 is to assemble in the gray staging area at 10:00am. MD5 is number 50 in the parade. All individuals representing MD5 are eligible to march in the parade. Each parade participant is to wear their official convention name tag. Attire for the parade is black pants, comfortable shoes, white shirt and the MD 5 vest.

Past Council Chairman Marv Chambers from Fillmore, Sask. is Canada's Candidate for

International Director. Vote for Marv at this convention and elect him as the next International Director from Multi-district 5. Marv has been a Lion for 40 years and has served in many District and Multi-district positions. He has also received several Presidential awards and is a Melvin Jones Fellow. Marv is a Lion with "Small town Roots with a Worldwide Perspective".

Seattle known as the "Emerald City" has many historical attractions and places to visit. A variety of day and evening tours are available – beginning July 2nd - from boat cruises, land tours, fine art tours, industrial, historical and natural wonders. Seattle offers many eating places with cuisine from around the world. July 3rd will be a day at a Seattle baseball game.

Peter Eyvindson, who lives in Clavet, SK has, through his efforts, helped many of the orphaned children in Haiti. Broken Wings Missions Inc supports the St. Joseph's Family of Homes in Haiti through the development and promotion of books or products about the homes and children.

St. Joseph's Home for Boys is a Christian-based home

for 35+ boys, generally under the age of 20 who have been welcomed in from the streets of Port au Prince and often out of the life of being a slave child.

Wings of Hope is located in Fermathe, Haiti and offers a caring family home to children with physical and/or development challenges.

The other home, Trinity House, is home to approximately 16 children and was established when the young men of St. Joseph's reached outside of their community to the community of Jacmel.

MD5 to Amend Constitution and By-Laws at Convention in June

The MD5 Council of Governors will propose several amendments to the MD5 Constitution and MD5 By-Laws at the business meeting of the MD5 Convention to be held in Deadwood, South Dakota, June 9-11, 2011. The Constitution and By-Laws, in their entirety and as proposed for amendment, are posted on the MD5 website. Due to the size of these documents, it is not possible to publish the documents in this publication. However, what follows is a general summary of the changes and serves as the official notice informing the club delegates of what will be proposed in June.

Constitutional Revisions

Article III Section 4(c) is amended to clarify the criteria by which a district governor's spouse, partner, or adult traveling companion receives funding from LCI to attend the international convention. Because LCI has the prerogative to change its policy pertaining to how the travel companion of the district governor is partially funded, the committee is recommending that the phrase, "as per Lions Clubs International policies," be inserted to allow the district to accept the changes from LCI without having to modify repeatedly the constitution.

Article VIII Section 4(b) is amended where the list of committees is removed from the document and replaced with a general statement that the District Governor shall appoint committee chairs as recommended by Lions Clubs International.

Article X Section 2 is being amended to allow for the use of electronic means when sending amendments in writing to the MD5 constitution revision committee.

By-Laws

Article I Section 3 is being amended to include 1st and 2nd Vice District Governors in the training. Several modifications are proposed to include both 1st and 2nd Vice District Governors throughout the document.

Article I Section 4 (d) is being amended to be consistent with the constitution Article III Section 4 (c) regarding the support of the adult traveling companion of the district governor.

Article II Section 5 is being amended to specify the role and specific responsibilities of the 1st Vice District Governor based upon the constitution and by-laws of LCI.

Article II Section 6 is being added to specify the role and specific responsibilities of the 2nd Vice District Governor based upon the constitution and by-laws of LCI.

The remaining sections of Article II are renumbered.

Article IX Section 1 (a) is being amended to be consistent with the constitution Article X Section 2 regarding the use of electronic means when sending amendments in writing to the constitution revision committee.

Greetings Lions, Lioness and Leos of District 5SKS.

The District Governor Team has started the last round of Team Visitations. Our first stop was at Avonlea, there was a good turnout from the new executive officers of the clubs. The District Governor Team gave presentations on Leadership Development. The next stop was Fillmore, another good turnout. At the end of the day we had trained more Presidents, Secretaries and Treasurers than the whole of the District last year. We have now covered three zones for the training. For those secretaries who didn't attend we want you to know you missed the opportunity to go online at the training to learn firsthand how easy it is to complete your reports on line.

District 5SKS received a grant from Lions Clubs International for Public Relations in the amount of \$3333.33. The District has purchased four laptop computers and projectors to be used throughout the District. Lions Clubs who would like to get this equipment to do a presentation in your community should contact the District Governor Team. Arrangements will be made for the Clubs to get the equipment.

Are you concerned about bullying, community safety or what the future holds for our young people? Lions Quest empowers adults to develop healthy, capable young people of strong character. In the last twenty five years over 50,000 educators have been trained to help young people develop skills for growing in adolescence, skills for action and managing conflict. To deal with bullying and the dangers of use of tobacco, drugs and alcohol. I have had questions from Lions members about people in the community promoting the Program Forty Developmental Assets. This people say Lions Quest doesn't cover the things

they do. I recently learned from Lions Quest Canada that Lions Quest developed the Forty Developmental Assets. Lions Quest uses 32 of the 40 assets. Forty Developmental Assets program was copied from Lions Quest. It is my understanding most of the programs being sold into the schools were developed by Lions Quest and copied by someone else.

Past International Directory Jack Isaman attended a meeting in Regina when Joanne McQuiggan from Lions Quest was in the city for a visit. There were representatives from both Districts in Saskatchewan. District Governor Doug Reid and I were both there for informational purposes. A new provincial committee to oversee the \$94,000.00 Core 4 Grant from Lions Clubs International Foundation has been formed and were present. There was a consensus that we need more trainers in the Province, this will be one of the priorities. There will be Lions Quest sessions across the province in the near future. This will be open to parents, family members and organizations who deal with youth. There has been training in the school system but it is difficult to promote this program without the support of the local Lions Clubs. Lion Eunice Cameron has trained many teachers and school staff. Lion Eunice informed the meeting, Lions Quest program provides a shift in Attitude, by the staff and young people. Lion Eunice has also trained the graduates from education at the Universities for some time now. There are many new teachers who have been exposed to Lions Quest before they start their teaching career.

The District has started work on two more new clubs, Whitewood and Kindersley. These are communities the District Governor Team feel would benefit from a Lions Club. The District Governor Team is also aware there are issues with some of our existing Clubs. Some are struggling with membership, reports or dues. The District is here to help any and all Clubs. During the last number of years the District has put people in place to help struggling clubs. The mindset of the day was we will respond when we get asked to help. It has taken a few years but we have learned waiting for a club with issues to ask for help hasn't worked. Plans have been developed this year to have members of the MERLOW team get to the clubs identified as struggling with membership, reports or dues. The District Gov-

ernor Team were proactive in this initiative. The District Governor Team travelled to Ponteix when we learned they were going to fold the club if they didn't receive help getting new members. We were able to assist them getting new members in their club and at this last round of visits inducted six of their new members. The District Governor Team inducted a new member in October and one in January. Way to go Ponteix!!!!!! We were looking at the reports on the Lions Clubs International Web site and see Carnduff has eleven new members. Way to go Carnduff!!!!!!

April is a month of celebration in our District. There are three Lions Clubs who are celebrating their 50th anniversaries. Congratulations to Lumsden and District Lions Club, Carnduff and District Lions Club and Fillmore and District Lions Club. The members of these clubs should be very proud. There are other clubs celebrating milestone anniversaries this year as well, Regina Lakeside celebrates 55 years, Glenavon celebrates 45 and Francis celebrates 45.

An extension workshop has been planned for April 10-12 in Whitewood. We have plans to start a new Lions Club in Whitewood. Eston 95 Lions club has renewed the extension work started in Kindersley and will have a new Lions Club there by the end of June. No pressure Lions, you still have three months left.

Secretaries, the WMMR site on Lions International web site will be changing. The learning center is up and running, this will answer questions on the Monthly Membership and Activities Reports and allow you to **practice** reporting without fear of losing the information on your club. For those of you who haven't heard, Lion Rick Pockett is willing to assist you with any

trouble you may have. Contact him by phone or email; he is listed in the District Directory as Cabinet Secretary and 2nd Vice District Governor. For those Secretaries who didn't get to the training sessions, you missed the chance to practice live on the internet at the WMMR site. Those secretaries who did attend and take the training found it very informative. To quote one of the secretaries "I must be really stupid, I resisted doing the reporting on line. After taking this training I see I was doing it the hard way."

Watch for information on Lions Quest courses close to you!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!

The Peace Poster theme was available in January so Clubs should have received their

information. The Opportunities for Youth Chairs would like to see the Peace Posters in the Schools as early as possible. The dead line for completion has changed to the end of June. Throughout this issue I will be SHINING A LIGHT on your foundations.

The Lions of 5SKN are truly Beacons of Hope to those less fortunate in our world.

Within 24 hours you put one million dollars into the hands of a Lions Club in Haiti to assist in the disaster. This was followed by another five million when you partnered with HELP a German non profit group to build new homes.

Within 24 hours you put one million dollars into the hands of a Lions Club in Pakistan Lions to assist with the disaster.

Within 24 hours you had five million dollars in the hands of a Lions Club in Japan to assist with the disaster.

Within a few days you put ten thousand dollars in the hands of the Maple Creek Lions in southern Saskatchewan to deal with the flooding.

Doesn't it make you feel good to know that you and your club were there to assist as those homes were swept out to sea by the tsunami in Japan?

Lions have voiced concern as to whether the money is getting to the right place and are Lions really making a difference. In each case the money goes to the local lions club so our track record is very good.

I do know that the need is great and dollars few. I ask for your continued support of Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF).

The Melvin Jones Fellowship still exists, however there are now 25, 50 and 100 dollar pins available. These make a great way to say thank you to a member and support LCIF at the same time.

No longer are you and your Lions Club training dogs for sight but also for medical and emotional purposes through your support of Lions Foundation of Canada (LFC).

Lions Audrey and I had the opportunity to see the difference a dog made to a young autistic boy. The behavioral pattern for many autistic children is to run. This young fellow sat quietly with his dog. His dog had no hair left

on his ears because the boy constantly rubbed them. This calmed the boy as he sat in front of the group. The dog would not allow the boy to run. He just sits down and barks. Imagine the peace of mind that gives the parents.

Does your Club have a dog walk?

If every Club in our district had a dog walk and only raised fifty dollars this district could buy a dog every other year.

Wouldn't it make you feel good just knowing that you and your Club provided someone with a better tomorrow?

The Saskatchewan Lions Foundation (SLF) has come up with a unique idea to raise money for the ophthalmology unit at the new children's hospital in Saskatoon. THE LION SHARE is a 50/50 raffle. Clubs have the choice of being involved.

Lions Quest is struggling. Since becoming Thrive the Lion's donations have dried up. Quest became Thrive in a bid to get grants. It has now returned to its former glory as Lions Quest Canada. Lions Quest operates on your donations and the sale of Quest materials. The Lions Quest Fellowship is awarded for donations of five hundred dollars.

Saskatchewan Lions have received a \$90,000 Core Four grant. Lions Wes Ulmer, Don Buglas and Mary Ann Rutko will be representing you on the steering committee to implement this grant.

Your Sight and Service Foundation is a great tool for Lions. Your Club supports this through your dues to the district. Donations are also accepted. You must apply for this grant for local endeavors. The grants are usually on a 50/50 basis. This is an in and out foundation. This means that you can have the foundation issue tax receipts for local fundraising purposes.

The Lions in 5SKN are being asked to be a Beacon of Service in their local community by supporting the drive to purchase two new vans for CBIB (Canadian National Institute for the Blind).

Lions of 5SKN have bought two new vans for the CNIB. These low mileage vans were bought for \$24,000 dollars. Lions have applied for a standard grant of \$12,000 dollars from LCIF. Cabinet is asking local Lion's Clubs to come up with the other \$12,000 dollars. This works out to about seven dollars per Lion.

These are your vans and local Lions drive the CNIB workers all around our province.

Several years ago I remember this van traveling to Meadow Lake to visit my mother who had developed macular degeneration and was losing her sight. I do not remember the Lion who drove the van but I vividly

remember the visually impaired worker who came visiting with his dog.

Please support this local effort and become Beacons of Hope in your own community.

Every Club has been asked to complete a short survey to have their say in how we keep Lions on the cutting edge. Thirty five Clubs have responded and this is what they said:

The full Cabinet should meet twice a year. The executive, region chairs, zone chairs should meet as required. The cabinet chairs would be invited only if their duties were at issue.

There should be fewer regions and zones. The regions have been reduced to 5 from 8. There is now a North West region 1, a North East region 2, a Central region 3, a South East region 4, and a South Central region 5. The zones have been reduced from 14 to 10. This has reduced Cabinet by 7 members. There are two zones in each region.

The District Governor should meet Clubs at the zone level. The zone meetings need to have a more formal structure. Zone chairs should be elected at a zone meeting. Convention should be moved to the fall. When the MD5 convention is in 5SKN we should not have a separate convention.

The other two issues addressed were leadership and membership. These are two issues have plagued us forever. LCI has attempted to address these issues with the MERLOW team concept. This has not worked well for many reasons. This has been replaced with a GLT (Global Leadership Team) and a GMT (Global Membership Team).

Over half the Clubs responding do not have a membership committee.

To assist with communications a LCI grant was applied for and I'm happy to report MD5 has received a ten thousand dollar grant. Our share is a third of that or \$3,333.00 dollars. Lions sometimes complain about the dues that they pay to Lions International. This is the third grant that we have received in Saskatchewan this year. In the years that I have been a Lion we have received far more back from Lions International than we have paid in dues.

The Lions of 5SKN have partnered with the Lions in 5SKN to create a Saskatchewan web site. This site has information specific to Saskatchewan Lions. This will become a one stop shopping centre for all the information that Clubs need to operate. There will be links to LCI, MD5, Lions eye bank, Sight & service foundation, etc.

Each Lions Club has their very own page where you can post items about your club. This is an opportunity for you to brag about your members and your club.

The Great Web Challenge was designed to show Lions the value of this web site. The challenge has been extended until the end of April and the winner will be announced on the web site.

Hardware has been purchased for use by Clubs. There will be projectors, monitors and laptops available for Club use. These may be borrowed from the region chair. These lap tops will be loaded with all the information about 5SKN programs like Quest, Speak off, peace poster etc.

I apologize for neglecting to make the Club 700 draw at convention. The draw will be made at the May 7th Cabinet meeting.

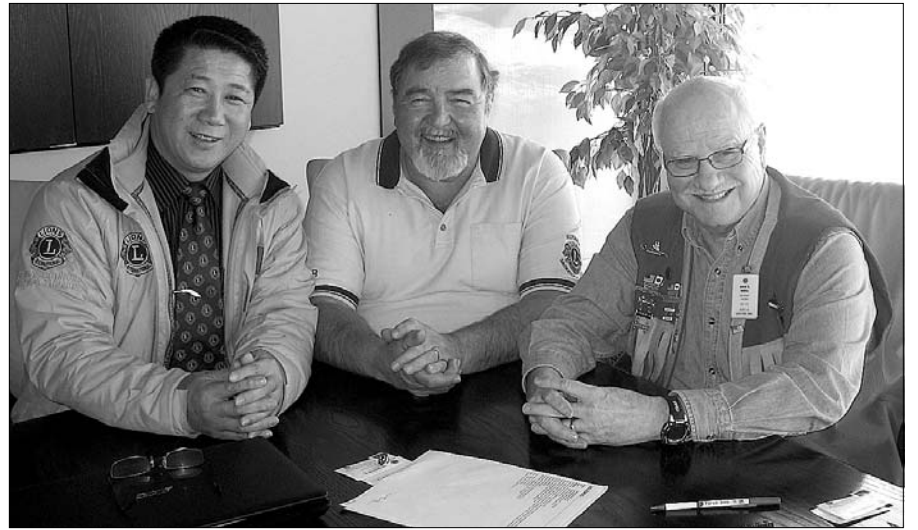
